PANKAJ JAIN, J. (Oral)

1. On 16.04.2024, following order was passed:-

“Fresh medical report has been filed that shows that the petitioner is suffering from incised Hernia. The same reads as under :-

“It is submitted that patient is known case of Cholecystectomy and ERCP Pancreatitis. On 06.04.2024 patient was referred to Civil Hospital Hoshiarpur for check-up in surgery department and his Ultra sound was advised which showed incised Hernia and there was no obstructed Hernia. Patient was advised for abdominal binder application and the medicines prescribes are followings:-

- 1. TAB Thiocolchicoside BD*
- 2. TAB Etracoxib BD*

On 10.04.2024 patient was referred again for check up in Medicine Department in Civil Hospital Hoshiarpur as patient complaint of fever on & off and decreased appetite. His vitals are stable BP 130/90 PR 80 per minute. The followings medicines were prescribed by Medicine Specialist:-

- 1. TAB Cefixime+Oflox 200 mg BD*
- 2. TAB MV OD*

3. TAB Pantop DSR: OD

4. TAB Diclo-Pcm

After perusal of blood reports patient was again referred to Civil Hospital Hoshiarpur on dated 13.04.2024 for Medicine specialist Opinion. The medicines prescribes were followings:-

1. TAB PCM 500 mg SOS

2. TAB Dicyslamine + Mefenac Acid SOS

3. TAB Rantac 150 mg Stat

4. TAB Allopurinol 300 MG OD

5. TAB Udiliv 300 mg OD

6. TAB Silymarin 40 mg BD

7. TAB Atorvas 10 mg

8. TAB Zinc+ Vitamin C OD

Diet prescribed is low protein diet.”

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that though as per report it has been stated that the petitioner is stable, however, his vital organs are under damage and it would be in the interest of the petitioner that he be ordered to be examined from a medical specialist.

In view of above, State is directed to get the petitioner examined from PGIMER, Chandigarh.

Adjourned to **29.04.2024.”**

2. In compliance thereof, short affidavit was filed by Baljit Singh PPS, Superintendent, Central Jail, Hoshiarpur on 29.04.2024. State was directed to produce the out patient card to show as to what was the opinion of the medical specialist of PGIMER. The same has been produced. Dr. Puneet Rai, Medical Officer, Central Jail is also present. It has been verified by him that the patient is suffering from acute hernia and needs to be operated. However, he submits that in his opinion, the surgery has to be undertaken at a Treasury Care Centre/Super Specialty Institute.

3. Keeping in view that the petitioner is suffering from ailment wherein he requires immediate medical assistance and the fact that he is accused of having been found to be in possession of 2.230 gms of heroin, this Court deems it fit to dispose off the present petition by directing the State authorities to get the petitioner operated as soon as possible.
4. Ms. Anmol, Advocate submits that the petitioner wants that he should be operated at PGIMER, Chandigarh only.
5. Ordered accordingly.
