1. As the issue involved is common, both the above captioned petitions are taken up for adjudication together. For the sake of convenience, facts are borrowed from *CWP No.14462 of 2002*.



2. The petitioner through instant petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India is seeking direction to respondents to promote him to the post of Deputy Superintendent of Police.
3. Learned State counsel pointing out reply submits that petitioner during the pendency of petition was promoted to the post of Deputy Superintendent of Police. He was not promoted in 2001 because he did not secure minimum marks i.e. 10. In the meeting of DPC held on 30.09.2002, he was found eligible and vide order dated 30.10.2002, was promoted, thus, his grievance stands redressed.
4. In the wake of statement of learned State counsel, the present petitions stand disposed of.
5. The petitioner is at liberty to move an appropriate application, if cause survives.
