1. The present petition has been filed under Sections 10 and 12 of the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971 read with Article 215 of the Constitution of India for initiation of contempt proceedings against the respondent for violating and disobeying order dated 05.12.2023 passed by this Court in CWP 27023-2023.
2. Counsel for the respondent submits that the order qua which the contempt is asserted, has since been complied with and, therefore, the present petition may be dismissed as having been rendered infructuous.
3. Counsel for the petitioner has not disputed the factual position.
