GURBIR SINGH, J. (ORAL)

1. The present revision petition has been filed under Article 227 of the Constitution of India for setting aside the impugned order dated 30.01.2024 (Annexure P-5) passed by the Ld. Civil Judge (Junior Division), Ludhiana wherein an application filed by the petitioners under Section 151 CPC for allowing the petitioners to examine official witness in additional evidence, has been dismissed.
2. After arguing for some time, learned counsel for the petitioners submits that he would be satisfied that if copy of the judgment dated 02.12.2023 (Annexure P-3) passed by the learned JMIC, Ludhiana in case titled as “Gurjeet Singh and another Vs. Jagtar Singh and others” is allowed to be tendered subject to question of relevancy to be decided in the final arguments.
3. If notice is given to the other side it may further delay the disposal of case and may further put financial burden upon respondents.
4. Without commenting anything on the merits of the case, present petition is disposed of with a direction to the trial Court to allow the petitioners to tender the copy of the judgment dated 02.12.2023 (Annexure P-3) passed by

the learned JMIC, Ludhiana subject to payment of costs of Rs.2000/- to be paid to the opposite party. The question whether judgment is relevant or not and can be read in support of the case would be decided by the trial Court at the time of the passing of the final judgment.

- 5. The judgment is ordered to be taken on record only with a view to avoid further delay of disposal of the main case.
- 6. If the respondents are not satisfied with this order, they can move an application for recalling of this order within 30 days.
- 7. Petition stands disposed of.
