1. Instant petition under Section 482 Cr.PC has been preferred seeking directions to respondents No. 2 and 3 to conduct fair and impartial enquiry in the complaint vide diary No. ICMS/2023/029602 dated 20.11.2023 (Annexure P-6) made by the petitioner.

2. Heard.

3. It is, *inter alia*, submitted by learned counsel for the petitioner that the petitioner being aggrieved by the acts and conduct of the private respondents had moved a representation dated 20.11.2023 (Annexure P-6) to respondent No. 2-the Senior Superintendent of Police, U.T. Chandigarh, but till date no action has been taken thereon.

4. Notice of motion to the official respondents.
5. On the asking of the Court, Mr. P. S. Paul, Addl. P.P. UT Chandigarh, accepts notice on behalf of the State-respondents No. 1 to 3 and, on instructions from ASI Jasbir Singh, P.S. Sector 34, Chandigarh, has submitted that the matter is under investigation of Cyber Cell, Sector 17, Chandigarh, and the decision on the representation dated 20.11.2023 (Annexure P-6) will be taken expeditiously within a period of three months from today in accordance with the law.
6. Faced with this situation and the categoric statement made by learned Additional P.P. UT, Chandigarh, learned counsel for the petitioner, prays for withdrawal of the instant petition at this stage with liberty to file the same afresh if so required in future in accordance with the law.
7. Disposed of as withdrawn at this stage with the aforesaid liberty.
