1. On 02.04.2024, the following order was passed by this

Court:-

“Mr. Navdeep Chhabra, Advocate, caused an appearance on behalf of complainant by filing his *vakalatnama*, the same is taken on record.

Reply filed on behalf of respondent no.1, which is taken on record. Copy, thereof, has been supplied to the learned counsel for the petitioner.

During the course of arguments, both counsel are *ad idem* that the matter can be settled in case same be sent to the Mediation and Conciliation Centre of this Court.

Parties are directed to appear before the Mediation and Conciliation Centre of this Court on 09.04.2024.

Petitioner is also directed to join investigation as and when called upon by the Investigating Officer concerned and in the eventuality of joining investigation, the petitioner be released on interim bail subject to his furnishing personal bonds and surety to the satisfaction of Arresting/Investigating Officer, and shall abide by the conditions as provided under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Adjourned to 06.05.2024.”

2. Thereupon on 06.05.2024, both the parties were directed to appear before the Mediation and Conciliation Centre of this Court, as there were chances of amicable settlement between the parties concerned.

3. The exercise done by the Mediator of the Mediation and Conciliation Centre of this Court, yield fruit, and the matter has been settled between the petitioner and the complainant.

4. As per the report of the Mediator, a settlement agreement dated 23.05.2024, has been arrived, which has been duly signed by the petitioner and the complainant. The said settlement agreement is taken on record as Annexure-A.

5. In view of the settlement agreement (*supra*), the present petition is **allowed**, and order dated 02.04.2024 is, hereby, made absolute, on the terms and conditions as envisaged under Section 438(2) of the Cr.P.C.

6. Both the parties shall remain bound by the terms and conditions of the settlement agreement (*supra*).
