1. This petition has been filed by the petitioner under Section 439 Cr.P.C. for grant of regular bail in case having FIR No.254 dated 26.07.2021, under Section 393 of IPC and Section 25 of Arms Act (Section 398 of IPC added later on), at Police Station Adampur, District Hisar.

2. The present case is relating to attempt to commit dacoity made by 3 unknown persons in ICICI bank on 26.07.2021 and thereafter, FIR was registered against the said 3 unknown persons. During investigation, petitioner was arrested in July 2021 and during investigation certain recoveries were effected. On completion of investigation, the police presented the challan. However, during trial, petitioner was granted bail vide order dated 22.03.2022 (Annexure P-2). Thereafter, the petitioner

jumped bail on 20.09.2022 and subsequently, he was arrested in one another criminal case on 03.10.2023 and re-arrested in the present case on 19.12.2023 after getting his production warrants from the Court concerned. The petitioner is now lodged in judicial custody since 19.12.2023.

3. The State counsel on instructions from ASI Sanjeev Kumar submits that trial is going on and till date, 2 witnesses are examined on behalf of the prosecution out of total 14 witnesses. However, the State counsel has not disputed the fact that FIR in this case was registered against unknown persons and the petitioner was later on nominated as accused and was earlier granted bail vide order Annexure P-2 by this Court.

4. In light of the above, no purpose is going to be served by keeping the petitioner behind the bars for any longer period.

5. Consequently, without expressing on the merits of the case, the present petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on regular bail subject to his furnishing bail/surety bonds to the satisfaction of the trial Court/CJM/Duty Magistrate concerned.
