The present petition has been filed under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India seeking a writ in the nature of certiorari for quashing the impugned orders dated 19.02.2024 (Annexure P-13 to P-16).

At the outset, Mr. Samarth Sagar, Advocate appearing on behalf of respondents No.2 and 3 stated on instructions from Mahender Singh Dhiman, XEN, OP Division, UHBVN that the Nigam has decided to withdraw the orders of termination qua the petitioners and now an opportunity will be granted to the petitioners in accordance with law and only after considering the replies, if any, filed by the petitioners to the notices issued that a final order will be passed in accordance with law and even now after issuance of notices to the petitioners, the date of hearing is also fixed for 28.03.2024. He also submitted that since the orders itself

have been withdrawn, the grievance of the petitioners with regard to recovery of salary has also become infructuous since no recovery is being made for the time they have already worked.

Learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioners submitted that in view of the statement made by the learned counsel for respondents No.2 and 3, the present petition may be disposed of as having rendered infructuous.
