1. The petitioner through instant through instant petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India is seeking setting aside of order (Annexure P-11) whereby he has been denied Constabulary Number as he did not appear before the Central Recruitment Board for adjudging his suitability.
2. Mr. Aman Dhir, DAG, Punjab submits that as per communication dated 08.08.2002, the petitioner was found suitable for the post of Constable and his name appeared at Serial No.1778 in the list of 4565 suitable SPOs. The petitioner, as per said communication, had to get Constabulary Number from the date of his turn. In all probabilities, the petitioner has already been granted Constabulary Number and he might have retired. Thus, present petition has rendered infructuous.

3. In the wake of statement of learned State counsel, the petition stands disposed of with liberty to the petitioner to move an appropriate application, if some cause survives.
4. Pending applications(s), if any, shall also stand disposed of.
