1. The petitioner through instant petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India is seeking setting aside of notice dated 30.08.2023 (Annexure P-3).
2. The petitioner was issued passport on 08.08.2023. The respondent has issued show cause notice dated 30.08.2023 (Annexure P-3) asking him to visit their office and clarify his position with respect to FIR No. 110 dated 09.06.2018, under Sections 370(3), 120-B of IPC as well as Sections 75, 79 Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act 2015 and Section 3(2)(iv) SC and ST (Prevention of Atrocities Act) 1989 registered at Police Station Division No.4, Jalandhar.
3. The petitioner claims that police, after completing investigation, has already filed cancellation report and he has disclosed this fact in the reply to show cause notice, however, respondent is not adjudicating the same.

4. Notice of motion.
5. Ms. Shreyanshi Verma, Central Govt. Counsel accepts notice on behalf of respondent Nos. 1 and 2 and assures the Court that Competent Authority would adjudicate impugned show cause notice within 8 weeks from today.
6. In the wake of statement of counsel for the respondent Nos. 1 and 2, the instant petition stands disposed of.
