1. The petitioner in the instant petition filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. is praying for quashing of the order dated 16.12.2023 (Annexure P-4) passed by the learned trial Court vide which he was declared a proclaimed person in case FIR No.44 dated 05.07.2022 under Section 21(A) of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985 registered at Police Station Airport, District Amritsar.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner had been regularly appearing before the Court concerned; subsequently, the bail granted to him was cancelled and bail bonds were forfeited to the State followed by the impugned order (Annexure P-4) and all these proceedings were not to his knowledge. Learned counsel further submits that the petitioner is ready to appear and join proceedings before the learned trial Court. Hence, in the aforementioned facts and circumstances, the petitioner be protected till his appearance before the

Court concerned and the Court be directed that his application, which he would be filing on his surrender, be decided expeditiously.

3. Notice of motion.

4. Mr. Amit Rana, Sr. Dy. Advocate General, Punjab who is present in Court, accepts notice on behalf of the State.

5. I have heard learned counsel for the parties and perused the relevant material on record.

6. In view of the limited prayer made by learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioner, the petition is disposed of with direction to the petitioner to appear and surrender before the learned trial Court by 07.03.2024. Till then, no coercive steps shall be taken against the petitioner, subject to payment of costs in the sum of ₹10,000/- which shall be deposited with the District Legal Services Authority, Amritsar.

7. However, it is made clear that in case the petitioner fails to surrender before the Court concerned within the above stipulated time period, this order shall be of no avail to him, thereafter. In case, on appearance and surrender, the petitioner moves an application for bail before the Court, the same shall be decided by the Court concerned expeditiously, in accordance with law.
