Present petition has been filed by the petitioners seeking quashing of order dated 15.2.2024 (Annexure P-8) passed by the Court of Chief Judicial Magistrate, Gurugram whereby the petitioners are declared as proclaimed persons in criminal case having FIR No.0468 dated 27.8.2017 registered under Sections 420 IPC and Section 3 of Haryana Protection of Interest of Depositors Act at Police Station DLF, Phase 1, Gurugram.

2. Counsel for the petitioners submits that the petitioners are residents of West Bengal and have never received any notice, summons or warrants from the Court concerned with regard to pendency of the criminal case against them in the Court at Gurugram. It is further submitted that now the matter stands compromised between the parties and the petitioners have already filed compromise quashing petition having CRM-M-8193-2024 wherein the parties are directed to get record their statements before the Court concerned and now the report of the said Court is awaited for 9.5.2024. He further submits that the petitioners are ready to join

proceedings before the trial Court and it is pleaded that the impugned order be set aside in order to facilitate the petitioners to get record their statements before the trial Court on the date fixed i.e. 19.3.2024.

3. Notice of motion.
4. Mr. Neeraj Sheoran, DAG, Haryana accepts notice on behalf of the State and submits that the present petition be disposed of in accordance with law in light of the fact that the matter stands compromised between the parties.
5. In view of above, the present petition is hereby disposed of with liberty to the petitioners to appear before the trial Court on 19.3.2024 or any other date convenient to the said Court/Illaq Magistrate for the purpose of recording their statements in compliance of order dated 21.2.2024 passed by this Court in CRM-M-8193-2024.
6. In the meantime, the police/Court concerned is not to take any coercive action against the petitioners.
