Prayer in this writ petition filed by the petitioners under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, is for issuance of a writ in the nature of certiorari, for quashing/setting-aside the order dated 07.10.2023 (Annexure P-23) passed by the respondent – Department (in pursuance to the direction issued by this Court vide order dated 26.07.2023 passed in CWP No.13718 of 2023) declining the claims of the petitioner and besides this all other orders as the petitioners have wrongly and illegally been not granted all such commensurate/collateral dues as are admissible for being paid to all Ex-Servicemen working/employed in the Banking sector on similar posts. Further a writ of mandamus has been sought for directing the respondents to assign all rights of the petitioners and grant all such requisite pay-scales, dues and dearness allowances in similar/commensurate terms as are being paid to all others i.e. Ex-Servicemen who after retirement like the petitioners are employed in the Banking sector and are performing duties exactly

commensurate similar to those of the petitioners and as such the petitioners are entitled to the stated benefits on similar terms/equitable basis without any impediment or question.

After arguing the matter for some time, learned counsel for the petitioners wishes to withdraw the present petition with liberty to file afresh petition, on the same cause of action, with better particulars.

Dismissed as withdrawn with aforesaid liberty.
