1 The petitioners have filed the present petition under Article 226 of
the Constitution of India with a prayer to direct the respondents No.2 and 3 to
protect the life and liberty of the petitioners and also directing the respondents
No.4 to 6 not to interfere in their lives and liberty.

2 Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that the petitioners have already submitted a representation dated 26.02.2024 (Annexure P-4) to the Senior Superintendent of Police, Chandigarh and he shall be satisfied if directions are issued to respondent No.2 to look into their representation dated 26.02.2024 (Annexure P-4)

3 Notice of motion to respondents No.1 to 3, at this stage.

4 On the asking of the Court, Mr. Anil Kumar Landharia, Addl.P.P ,
U.T, Chandigarh, who is present in the Court, accepts notice on behalf of
respondents No.1 to 3.

5 I have heard learned counsel for the parties.

6 In view of the limited prayer made by learned counsel for the petitioners and without expressing anything on the merits and claim of the parties, respondent No.2– The Senior Superintendent of Police, Chandigarh, is directed to depute a senior officer to look into the representation (Annexure P-4) and after seeking a report, he may pass an appropriate orders, in accordance with law.

7 This order shall not be construed as an expression of opinion on the validity of the marriage of the parties. The parties mentioned in the petition or any other person mentioned in the petition shall be at liberty to take recourse to appropriate law, if any.

8 With these observations, this petition is disposed of.
