Prayer in this application is for exempting the applicant-petitioner from filing certified copies of Annexures P-1 to P-9.

The application is allowed as prayed for subject to all just exceptions. Annexures P-1 to P-9 are taken on record.

CRWP-2319-2024

Prayer in the present writ petition filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India is for protection of life and liberty of the petitioner, which according to the petitioner, is in danger on account of the constant frivolous complaints being submitted by respondent No.4.

2. It has been averred in the petition that the petitioner was the Manager of the Bhunsla Primary Agriculture Cooperative Society Limited, Village Bhunsla, District Kaithal and he had been performing his duties diligently and in accordance with law. Respondent No.4 started submitting false and frivolous complaints against him, including complaints with regard to illegal appointments having been made by the petitioner. Reference has

been made in the petition as regards the appointment of one Gurjant Singh, Peon and Virender Singh, Chowkidar.

3. It has been averred in the petition that in the inquiry conducted by the authorities, the petitioner was found to be innocent and even despite the said fact, the petitioner was being harassed and humiliated. Reference has been made to certain reports (Annexures P-3 and P-4) submitted by the concerned authorities. Thereafter, complaints were filed against the petitioner at the 'CM Window'. A departmental inquiry was conducted and it was found that no fraud had been committed by the petitioner.

4. It has been averred that again a complaint was submitted in the year 2023 (Annexure P-6). Complaints were also made to the police and the police has started harassing the petitioner. A representation in this regard was also submitted by the petitioner on 17.01.2024 (Annexure P-10) to the concerned authority, but to no avail.

5. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner is facing continuous harassment and apprehends that he would be implicated in some false case. He submits that despite a representation having been submitted on 17.01.2024, he is facing constant harassment at the hands of the police.

6. I have considered the submissions made by learned counsel for the petitioner.

7. At this stage, I do not deem it appropriate to issue notice to the respondents, but at the same time, the authorities would be required to look into the matter, keeping in view the nature of the allegations levelled in the petition.

8. In view of the above, the present petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No.2 to look into the representation dated

17.01.2024 (Annexure P-10) moved by the petitioner and take action on the same, if so warranted, in accordance with law.
