1. Learned State counsel, at the outset, submits that petitioner has passed away, thus, present petition has rendered infructuous. He has produced copy of her Death Certificate which is taken on record as Annexure ‘A’. Registry is directed to tag the same at an appropriate place.
2. The petitioner was claiming share in the terminal/retiral dues of her son. The respondent paid substantial amount to wife and son of deceased employee whereas petitioner was claiming share on the ground that she is mother of deceased employee. As the petitioner has passed away, the petition has rendered infructuous.
3. Dismissed as infructuous.
