1. The petitioner has filed the instant writ petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India claiming the following reliefs :-

“(i) Issue a writ of certiorari or such other appropriate writ, quashing the action of the respondents in changing service conditions/status of the petitioner from departmental employee to that outsourcing employee from 01.07.2018 as per memo dated 04.06.2018 (Annexure P-16) after his 17 years continuous service, as patently wrong, illegal, arbitrary, unfair, unconstitutional and against the policy dated 04.03.1999 (Annexure P-1) under which right accrued to the petitioner for getting his cases considered for regularization of his service and further to quash/set aside the memo dated 04.06.2018 (P-16) being contrary to the aforesaid policy and detriment to the right/ interest of the petitioner;

(ii) A writ in the nature of Mandamus directing the respondents to consider and grant the petitioner



regularization of his service from the due date in view of policy dated 04.03.1999 (P-1) and also in view of various judgments of this Hon'ble court and also from the Hon'ble Supreme court on the issue with all the consequential benefits arising there-from viz pay-fixation in the regular pay scales from time to time with arrears, seniority etc.

(iii) A writ in the nature of prohibition may also be issued restraining the respondents from terminating the service of the petitioner or changing his service conditions from department employee to that of employee on outsourcing basis on the strength of impugned decision circulated vide memo dated 04.06.2018 (P-16) during the pendency of the present writ petition.”

2. Pursuant to notice of motion, written statement on behalf of the respondents has been filed in the Court today, which is taken on record. Along with written statement, office order dated 09.05.2024 has been attached as Annexure R-1, whereby the services of the petitioner has been ordered to be regularized. However, it has been stated in the said order that order regarding effective date of regularization and other terms and conditions of the service will be issued separately as per the instructions of the PSPCL at later stage.

3. Learned counsel for the respondents submits that the said separate order has not been issued so far and is under process.

4. There is no representation on behalf of the petitioner.

5. In view of the above, the present petition is disposed of with a direction to the respondents to pass necessary order regarding effective date of regularization and other terms and conditions of service, within a period of 03 months from today and all the necessary



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benefits as permissible, including the retiral dues of the petitioner, shall be released, within a period of 03 months thereafter.
