1. The petitioner through instant petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India is direction to respondents to pay his arrears.
2. The petitioner joined respondent-C.R.P.F. on 08.05.2005 and resigned on 11.02.2017 after completing service of 11 years. He supplied documents to respondents to release his retiral benefits. The respondent vide letter dated 21.12.2021 (Annexure P-2) asked him to submit documents which he has already submitted.
3. Mr. Ajay Chaudhary, Advocate submits that grievance of the petitioner, at this stage, would be redressed if respondents are directed to consider and decide representation/legal notice dated 29.01.2024 (Annexure P-4) in a time bound manner.

4. Ms. Krishna Dayama, learned counsel for the respondents, who on advance notice is present in Court, assures the Court that competent authority would look into representation/legal notice dated 29.01.2024 (Annexure P-4) and pass an appropriate order within 8 weeks from today.

5. In the wake of statement of both sides, the present petition stands disposed of with a direction to respondents to decide representation/legal notice dated 29.01.2024 (Annexure P-4) of the petitioner within 8 weeks from today.
