JAGMOHAN BANSAL, J. (Oral)

1. The petitioner through instant petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India is seeking direction to respondent Nos.3 and 4 to issue Police Clearance Certificate/No Objection Certificate for the purpose of renewal of his passport.

Learned counsel for the petitioner confines his prayer to issuance of emergency travel document to enable him to visit India.

2. The petitioner is a resident of Hoshiarpur, however, at present is staying in England. He has been implicated in FIR No.68 dated 28.03.2005 under Sections 304/34 of Indian Penal Code, 1860 registered at Police Station

Tanda, District Hoshiarpur. His passport has expired, thus, he is unable to come to India.

3. Mr. Karan Singh, Central Government Counsel for Union of India, who on advance notice is present in Court, submits that passport of the petitioner cannot be renewed, however, emergency certificate/travel document would be issued within four weeks from the date of application, if any, filed by the petitioner.

4. In the wake of statement of counsel for Union of India, the petition stands disposed of.

5. Pending application(s), if any, shall also stand disposed of.
