MANJARI NEHRU KAUL, J. (ORAL)

1. The petitioner is seeking the concession of bail under Section 438 Cr.P.C. in case FIR No.148 dated 28.07.2023 for the offences under Sections 420, 465, 467, 468, 471, 120B of the IPC registered at Police Station Guruharsahai, District Ferozepur.

2. On the last date of hearing, i.e. 20.03.2024, while noticing the following submissions made by learned counsel for the petitioner, this Court had granted the concession of interim bail to the petitioner and asked him to join investigation.

“Learned counsel inter alia contends that after registration of the FIR in question, the parties have amicably resolved the dispute. In support he has drawn the attention of this Court to Annexure P-3, which is an affidavit dated 02.09.2023 of the complainant Arvinder Singh. It has been further submitted that the identically



placed co-accused Manjit Singh, has already been admitted to interim bail by this Court vide order dated 22.02.2024.”

3. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that in compliance of the order dated 20.03.2024, the petitioner has joined investigation and cooperated with the investigating agency.

4. Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Tirlok Singh, does not dispute the factum of the petitioner having joined investigation and cooperated with the investigating agency. He, on further instructions submits that the petitioner is not required for further investigation much less for his custodial interrogation.

5. In the circumstances, the petition is allowed and the interim order dated 20.03.2024 is made absolute subject to the conditions laid down in Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. Needless to say, in case the petitioner misuses the concession of bail granted to him, the State would be at liberty to seek cancellation of the bail granted to him.
