1. The present petition has been filed under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India for issuance of a direction to respondents No. 2 and 3 to protect the life and liberty of the petitioners and to restrain the private respondents No. 4 to 11 not to interfere in their peaceful life.
2. Learned counsel for the petitioners contends that the petitioners are residing in live-in relationship with each other against the wishes of respondents No. 4 to 10 and petitioner No. 1 claims herself to be 19 years of age whereas petitioner No. 2 claims himself to be 20 years of age and seek protection to their life and liberty. They apprehend danger from respondents No. 4 to 10. The petitioners have also submitted a representation (Annexure P-3) to respondent No. 2 but no action has been taken so far.
3. Notice of motion to official respondents only.

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4. Mr. Subhash Godara, Addl. A.G. Punjab, who is present in Court accepts notice for the official respondents. Counsel for the petitioners is directed to supply a copy of complete paper book to the counsel appearing for the State during the course of the day.

5. Without commenting on the validity of their relationship and entering upon an exercise to evaluate the evidentiary value of the documents placed on the file, I dispose of this petition with direction to respondent No.2 to decide the representation of the petitioners (Annexure P-3) within a period of one week from the date of receipt of a copy of this order and and grant them protection, if there is any threat to their life and liberty in accordance with law.

6. It is made clear that this order shall not be taken to protect the petitioners from legal action for violation of law, if any committed by them.
