1. Present writ petition has been filed under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India for issuance of a writ in the nature of certiorari for quashing the impugned order dated 11.03.2024 (Annexure P-24) vide which respondent No.2 has cancelled the permission granted on 07.08.2023 for running the Saraswati Public School at Kalawar. Other prayers have also been made in the petition.

2. Learned State counsel has raised a preliminary objection in the present writ petition to the effect that an appeal lies against the impugned order dated 11.03.2024 (Annexure P-24) before the Secretary, Secondary Education, Haryana.

3. Learned senior counsel for the petitioner has submitted that in view the said objection, the petitioner seeks to withdraw the present writ petition with liberty to file a statutory appeal. It is further submitted that the petitioner would file the said appeal within a period of one week from today and has prayed that in case of doing so, the competent authority be directed to decide the said appeal as expeditiously as possible.

4. In view of the above, the present writ petition is dismissed as withdrawn, with the liberty to the petitioner to institute the statutory appeal against the impugned order dated 11.03.2024 and in case of doing so by the petitioner within a period of one week from today, the competent authority is directed to decide the same as expeditiously as possible.
