By way of present petition filed under Section 438 Cr.P.C., petitioners pray for grant of anticipatory bail in case FIR No.65 dated 15.12.2022 registered at Police Station Cyber Police Station, Rohtak under Sections 419/420 and 120B IPC read with Section 66C and 66D of Informaton Technology Act, 2000.

On instructions from ASI Sandeep Kumar, learned State Counsel, submits that the petitioners have joined the investigation.

Status report by way of affidavit of Shri Ravi Khundia, HPS, Deputy Superintendent of Police, Rohtak has been filed on behalf of the respondent-State.

Apart from above, learned counsel for the petitioners submits that an amount of ₹2 lakhs which was received by the petitioners, has already been returned to the complainant on 23.04.2024. Learned counsel has also placed on record communication e-mail dated 23.04.2024 in this regard.

In view of the afore-said facts and circumstances, order dated 21.03.2024 whereby interim anticipatory bail was granted to the petitioners in the FIR in question, is hereby made absolute. However, the petitioners shall continue

to join the investigation as and when required by the Investigating Officer and make compliance of the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Learned counsel for the petitioners also submits that the petitioners being industrialists have to travel abroad on regular basis and that the condition of the bail to the effect that they will not leave the country without permission of the Court will be cumbersome for them.

The said condition is hereby modified to the extent that as and when the petitioners have to travel abroad, they will inform the Court at least one week prior to leaving India detailing their programme and further inform the Court after coming back to India, within 07 days.
