NAMIT KUMAR, J. (ORAL)

1. The petitioner has filed the instant writ petition under Articles 226 of the Constitution of India, seeking a writ of mandamus, directing the respondents to release the retiral benefits of the petitioner including G.P.F., Pension, Commutation of Pension, DCRG etc. along with interest @ 18% per annum.
2. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that despite her best efforts, she has not been able to get further instructions from the petitioner.
3. In this view of the matter, the present petition is dismissed for non-prosecution. However, liberty is granted to the petitioner to revive the same in case any cause still survives.
