1. The present petition has been filed under Section 12 of the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971, for initiating contempt proceedings against the respondent for willful and deliberate disobedience of order dated 14.08.2018, passed by this Court in CWP 16290-2013.

2. Vide order dated 22.04.2021, the present petition was adjourned at the request of counsel for the petitioner to respond to the query as to whether any conscious decision had been taken with regard to holding of TET in view of guidelines, issued by NCTE, in terms of order dated 14.08.2018 in CWP 16290-2013. It was ordered that the petition be listed as and when the needful is done. However, counsel for the petitioner has not taken any step to comply with aforesaid orders.

3. Although, counsel for the petitioner has been informed by the Registry qua the date fixed today, yet there is no representation on behalf of the petitioner.

4. In view of the above, this Court does not find any justified reason to continue with the present contempt petition any more.
