On 21.03.2023 the following order was passed:-

“ *The prayer in this petition under Section 482 Cr.PC is for the quashing of the order dated 09.01.2024 (Annexure P-6) passed by JMIC Amritsar whereby Non Bailable Warrants of arrest have been issued against the petitioner and the order dated 02.02.2024 (Annexure P-7) whereby proclamation warrants have been issued against the petitioner in a complaint under Section 138 of the Negotiable Instruments Act, 1881.*

The counsel for the petitioner contends that the counsel for the petitioner at the Trial Court could not appear on 09.01.2024 on which date the impugned order came to be passed. He states that petitioners are ready and willing to join the proceedings once again.

Notice of motion for 16.05.2024.

In the meanwhile, the petitioner is directed to surrender before the Trial Court within a period of one week

from today and subject to a deposit of Rs.15,000/- as costs with

the Sadhna Society for the Mentally Handicapped, Near Housing Board Chowk, Raien Basera Building, Manimajra, Sector 13, Chandigarh he shall be admitted to interim bail to the satisfaction of the Trial Court.

The petitioner is further directed to place on record the photocopy of receipt of payment as well as the order passed by the court below granting interim bail to the petitioner.”

The Counsel for the petitioner contends that in compliance of the aforementioned order the petitioner has surrendered and has since been granted the concession of interim bail vide order dated 28.03.2024 (Mark ‘A’).

In view of the above, no further orders are required to be passed by this Court.

Disposed of.

However, it is made clear that the petitioner shall continue to appear before the Trial Court and shall not absent himself without any sufficient cause.
