VIKAS BAHL, J.(ORAL)

1. Present Civil Writ Petition has been filed under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India praying for issuance of a writ in the nature of mandamus directing the official respondents to act in accordance with law and implement the orders dated 24.05.2021 (Annexure P-2) passed by respondent No. 4 and order dated 01.02.2022 (Annexure P-3) passed by respondent No. 5, whereby respondent No. 6-School has been ordered to be closed down and compliance report of the same is ordered to be filed.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that the only ground on which the orders were not being implemented was the interim order dated 29.06.2022 passed in Civil Revision No. 2450 of 2022.

3. Learned State counsel appearing for respondent Nos. 1 to 5 has submitted that vide order dated 07.04.2024, the District Elementary Education Officer has written a letter to the Deputy Commissioner, Rewari to restart the proceedings to shut down respondent No. 6-School and the said process would be done as expeditiously as possible in accordance with law.

4. Learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that the said stand of learned State counsel satisfies the claim of the petitioner and has submitted that the State would be bound by the statement made before this Court.

5. Keeping in view the above facts and circumstances, the present petition is disposed of as having been rendered infructuous at this stage.

6. The State would be bound by the statement made before this Court.
