PANKAJ JAIN, J. (Oral)

1. The petitioner has prayed for grant of anticipatory bail in

FIR No.228 dated 04.04.2022 registered under Sections 406/420/120-B

of IPC at Police Station Rohtak City, District Rohtak.

2. On 01.04.2024, while issuing notice of motion the following

order was passed:-

*“Apprehending his arrest in FIR No.228 dated 04.04.2022
registered under Sections 406/420/120-B of IPC at Police Station
Rohtak City, District Rohtak, petitioner seeks pre-arrest bail.*

*Learned counsel for the petitioner inter alia submits that so far as the
material allegation is concerned that is against co-accused
Dr.Krishan. Even if the FIR is taken on its face value, it is the said*

accused who allured the complainant and whole of the money was also him paid to him and another co-accused but not to the petitioner.

Notice of motion for 06.05.2024.

On the asking of the Court, Mr. Tarun Aggarwal, Sr. DAG, Punjab appears and accepts notice on behalf of the respondent-State.

In the meantime, in the event of arrest, the petitioner shall be released on interim bail subject to his furnishing personal and surety bonds to the satisfaction of the arresting officer/Investigating Officer. As and when called, the petitioner shall join the investigation. He shall abide by the conditions enumerated under Section 438(2) of the Cr.P.C.”

3. Today, learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Virender Singh has stated that pursuant to the order dated 01.04.2024, the petitioner has joined investigation and is no longer required for custodial interrogation.

4. In view of above, the interim order dated 01.04.2024 passed by this Court is made absolute, subject to the conditions as enumerated under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

5. This order should not be treated as "blanket" order. It will not be read granting petitioner indefinite protection from arrest. It shall be confined to the FIR mentioned *ibid* and will not operate in respect of any other incident that involves commission of an offence.

6. This order does not in any manner limit or restrict the rights or duties of the police or investigating agency, to investigate into the charges against the petitioner.

7. The petitioner shall be deemed to be in custody for the purpose of Section 27 of the Evidence Act, 1872 in regard to a discovery

of facts made in pursuance of information supplied by the petitioner in case the occasion arises.

8. It will be open to the police or the investigating agency to move this court for a direction under Section 439 (2) Cr.P.C. to arrest the accused, in the event of violation of any term, such as absconding, non-cooperating during investigation, evasion, intimidation or inducement to witnesses with a view to influence outcome of the investigation or trial.

9. Petition stands disposed off.

10. Needless to say that anything observed herein shall not be construed to be an opinion on the merits of the case.
