1. Present petition has been filed under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India praying for issuance of writ in the nature of *mandamus* directing the respondent to refix and revise the pay of the petitioners w.e.f. 01.01.2006, along with consequential arrears.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioners at the outset confines his prayer for deciding legal notice dated 14.01.2019 (Annexure P-11). He submits that at this stage, petitioners would be satisfied, if the said legal notice is considered and decided by passing a speaking order in a time-bound frame.

Without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case or the claim being made by the petitioners in the present petition, respondent is directed to consider and decide the claim made by the petitioners in legal notice dated 14.01.2019 (Annexure P-11) in accordance with law, by passing a speaking order within a period of three months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order. In case, the petitioners are found entitled, necessary benefits be released within a period of three weeks thereafter.
