JAGMOHAN BANSAL, J (ORAL)

1. The petitioner through instant petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India is seeking direction to respondents to grant family pension as well as other terminal dues.

2. The petitioner claims that she is widow of late Binda Siri Sada alias Bindeshari Sada who was working with respondents and passed away on 04.06.2021 after his retirement. The petitioner claims that she is entitled to family pension, gratuity and arrears.

3. Mr. Anil Sharma with Mr. Arav Gupta and Mr. Sanjiv Ghai, Advocates on instruction from Pawan Kumar, Senior Assistant submit that arrears with respect to pension and family pension from 01.05.2019 to 30.04.2024 have already been released and as per their instructions. The case of gratuity has been processed and it would be released within 4 weeks along with interest @ 6% p.a.

4. They further submit that claim of family pension was sent to office of Accountant General (A&E). PPO Number has already been issued to the petitioner and family pension would be directly transferred in her bank account by office of Accountant General (A&E). This exercise is likely to be completed within 4 weeks from today.
5. In the wake of statements of learned counsel for the respondents, the present petition stands disposed of.
