Prayer in the instant petition filed under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India is for issuance of directions to respondents No. 2 and 3 to provide protection of life and liberty to the petitioners, who have married against wishes of private respondents No. 4 and 5.

Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that petitioner No. 1-Aarti, aged about 22 years and petitioner No. 2-Raj Kumar, aged about 29 years, have got married on 28.03.2024, against wishes of the family members/relatives/friends of petitioner No. 1 (Aarti), arrayed as respondent Nos. 4 and 5. It has been further submitted that private respondents are threatening and trying to interfere in the marital life of petitioners. Hence, they are seeking protection in this regard and have approached this Court by way of filing the instant petition.

Notice of motion only to official respondents No. 1 to 3 is being issued, at this stage.

At the asking of Court, Mr. Harpreet Singh, Additional A.G. Punjab, who is present in the Court, accepts notice on behalf of respondents No. 1 to 3-State.

Given the nature of order being passed, there is no necessity to seek any response by official respondents No. 1 to 3 or even to serve private respondents No. 4 and 5.

In view of the above, present petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No. 2-Senior Superintendent of Police, District Fazilka, to look into representation dated 30.03.2024 (Annexure P-5), qua threat perception, if any, and take necessary steps, if any required, in accordance with law to ensure that life and liberty of the petitioners is not jeopardized at the hands of private respondents No. 4 and 5.

However, this direction shall not be construed to validate the marriage, said to have taken place between the petitioners. This order shall also not be taken to protect the petitioners from legal action for violation of law, if any, committed by them and will have no effect on any civil or criminal action, which could be initiated in the matter in accordance with law.
