1. By way of present petition filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C., prayer has been made for issuance of direction to respondents No.2 and 3 to conduct fair and impartial enquiry in the representation and to take legal action against accused persons, who despite having committed cognizable offence are roaming scot free as well as to find out the whereabouts of the sister of the petitioner, namely, Manpreet Kaur.

2. At the outset, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that instead of pressing the present petition on merits, his client would be satisfied in case direction is issued to the official respondents to decide representation dated 20.02.2024 (Annexure P-1) moved at the instance of petitioner by passing a speaking order expeditiously.

3. Prayer seems to be justified.

4. Upon advance notice, Mr. Kewal Singh, Addl. A.G., Punjab

appears on behalf of respondents-State and raises no objection to the innocuous prayer made on behalf of the petitioner. Requisite copies of the petition have already been supplied to the respondents-State by the learned counsel for the petitioner.

5. In view of the agreed stand taken by both sides, but without going into the merits of the controversy, the present petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No.2-Senior Superintendent of Police, Amritsar Rural to look into the representation dated 20.02.2024 (Annexure P-1) and decide the same in accordance with law by passing a speaking order preferably within a period of 02 (two) weeks from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.
