1. By this order, four connected cases i.e SAO-19, 20 and 23 of 2020 and CR-2283-2020 shall stand disposed of.

2. In all these four cases, the correctness of an interlocutory order passed by the First Appellate Court on 12.03.2020 is assailed. Sh. Deepak Jindal, Advocate, who has filed SAO-19 and 20 of 2020 submits that he has no instructions in the matter. Sh.Munish Gupta, Advocate represents the appellants in SAO-23-2020 and Sh.Manpreet Singh Longia, Advocate represents the petitioners in CR-2283-2020.

3. The dispute is with regard to the management of a property of a religious institution. The trial court, on 04.01.2020, while deciding the suit filed under Section 92 of the Code of Civil Procedure, 1908 passed a decree. The First Appellate Court by an interlocutory order partially stayed the decree while directing the Tehsildar (revenue official) to perform the duties of the receiver.

4. It has been stated that on more than one occasion, directions have been issued to the First Appellate Court to decide the pending appeals against the decree dated 04.01.2020. These appeals are pending

for the last four years. The interlocutory order dated 12.03.2020 continued to operate during all this while.

5. It has been brought to the notice of the Court that appeals are now listed for 14.05.2024.

6. Keeping in view the aforesaid facts, these appeals/revision petition are disposed of while requesting the First Appellate Court to decide the pending appeals on 14.05.2024 or within a period of next 15 days, from 14.05.2024.

7. All the pending miscellaneous applications, if any, are also disposed of.
