HARPREET SINGH BRAR J. (ORAL)

1. This petition has been filed under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure seeking quashing of FIR No.0311 dated 30.05.2022 under Sections 315/323/34/354/377/406/498-A/506 of IPC registered at Police Station Sonipat City, Sonipat (Annexure P-1) along with all subsequent proceedings arising therefrom on the basis of compromise dated 04.03.2024 (Annexure P-2).

2. The following order was passed on 25.04.2024:

“This petition has been filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. seeking quashing of FIR No.0311 dated 30.05.2022 under Sections 315/323/34/354/377/406/498-A/506 of IPC registered at Police Station Sonipat City, Sonipat (Annexure P-1) along with all subsequent proceedings arising therefrom on the basis of compromise dated 04.03.2024 (Annexure P-2).

Learned counsel for the petitioner inter alia submits that the dispute between the petitioner and respondent No.2 is purely private and they have compromised the matter and have already filed a petition under Section 13-B of the



Hindu Marriage Act seeking dissolution of marriage with mutual consent.

Notice of motion for 28.05.2024.

At this stage, on the asking of the Court, Ms. Geeta Sharma, DAG, Haryana accepts notice on behalf of respondent No.1-State and Mr. Vishal Singh Borwal, Advocate accepts notice for respondent No.2 and files his power of attorney and admits to the factum of compromise. Copy of the paper book be supplied to them during the course of day.

Service is complete.

In the meanwhile, the parties are directed to appear before the learned trial Court/Illaqa Magistrate within two weeks from today or any other date convenient to the trial Court/Illaqa Magistrate, to get their statements recorded regarding compromise and after recording their statements, learned trial Court/Illaqa Magistrate is directed to send report regarding the genuineness of compromise and also to intimate whether any PO proceedings are pending against any of the party on or before the date fixed i.e. 28.05.2024.

A copy of the order be sent to learned trial Court/Illaqa Magistrate through fax for compliance.”

3. In compliance of the aforesaid order, a report has been received from the concerned jurisdictional Court that the compromise between the parties is genuine and arrived at without any pressure or coercion from anyone.

4. In view of the compromise and the ratio of law laid down by the Hon’ble Supreme Court in **Narinder Singh and others vs. State of Punjab and another, (2014) 6 SCC 466, Ramgopal and another Vs. State of Madhya Pradesh 2021 SCC OnLine SC 834 and Shakuntala Sawhney (Mrs) Vs. Kaushalya (Mrs.) and others (1980) 1 SCC 63** and Full Bench of this Court in **Kulwinder Singh Vs. State of Punjab 2007 (3) RCR (CrI.) 1052**, this petition is allowed and FIR No.0311 dated 30.05.2022 under Sections

315/323/34/354/377/406/498-A/506 of IPC registered at Police Station Sonipat City, Sonipat and all subsequent proceedings arising out of the same are quashed, qua the petitioner.
