This is a civil writ petition filed under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India for issuance of a writ in the nature of certiorari for quashing the speaking order dated 14.02.2017(Annexure P-5), Enquiry report dated 28.01.2017/01.02.2017 (Annexure P-8) and Enquiry Report dated 16.10.2017 (Annexure P-10).
2. On 26.04.2024, this Court was pleased to pass the following order:-
