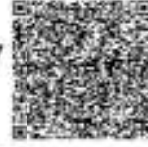

1. The petitioner seeks grant of anticipatory bail in respect of the
aforementioned FIR.
2. At the time of issuance of notice of motion, the following order
was passed on 10.04.2024:-

*“The petitioner seeks grant of anticipatory bail in respect of a
case registered against him vide FIR No. 15 dated 09.03.2024,
Police Station Dehlon, District Ludhiana, under Sections 379-
B(2), 323, 34 IPC.*

*The FIR was lodged at the instance of Bhinder Singh wherein it
is alleged that on the day of occurrence i.e. on 09.03.2024 at
about 9 am when he was proceeding from his house for his
work, then two unidentified persons came on a motorcycle.
While the driver of the motorcycle had muffled his with a piece
of cloth, the pillion rider was clean shaven. It is alleged that
the clean shaven person inflicted an injury on his right thumb*

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with a 'Dah' and both of them forcibly took him to nearby bushes, gave beatings and snatched an amount of Rs.3000/-. The complainant further alleged that he kept of looking for the said persons and came to know that the driver of the motorcycle was Manpinder Singh and the pillion rider was Pargat Singh.

Learned counsel submits that he has falsely been implicated in the present case and it remains absolutely unexplained as to how the complainant came to know about the identity of the two accused who were otherwise not known to the complainant. Learned counsel further submits that the petitioner has a clean record and is not involved in any other case.

Meanwhile, in the event of arrest, the petitioner be released on interim bail subject to his furnishing personal bonds and surety bonds to the satisfaction of Arresting/Investigating Officer. However, the petitioner shall join the investigation as and when called upon to do so and cooperate with the Arresting/Investigating Officer and shall abide by the conditions as provided under Section 438 (2) Cr.P.C.”

3. Learned State counsel, upon instructions from ASI Subhash Chand has informed that pursuant to interim directions, the petitioner has since joined investigation and he is not required for any custodial interrogation. It has also been informed that the petitioner is not involved in any other case.

4. Having regard to the aforestated position, wherein the petitioner is stated to have joined investigation and is not required for any custodial interrogation, the petition is accepted and the interim directions

issued by this Court vide order dated 10.04.2024 are hereby made absolute,



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subject to the condition that the petitioner shall join investigation as and when called upon to do so and cooperate with the Investigating Officer and shall also abide by the conditions as provided under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.
