1. The present petition has been filed under Article 215 of the Constitution of India read with Sections 10 and 12 of the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971, for initiating the contempt proceedings against the respondents for non-compliance and intentionally disobedience of order dated 06.11.2023 passed by this Court in CWP 24867-2023.
2. Notice of motion.
3. On the asking of Court, Mr. Pawan Kumar Longia, DAG, Haryana accepts notice on behalf of the respondent. While referring to affidavit dated 16.07.2024, furnished by respondent No. 2, he has submitted that the order qua which the contempt is asserted; has since been complied with and, as such, the present petition may be dismissed as having been rendered infructuous. The registry is directed to tag the aforesaid affidavit with the file after scanning the same, at an appropriate place.
4. In view of the above, the present contempt petition is dismissed as having been rendered infructuous.
5. However, if any of the grievances of the petitioner is left un-redressed, he would be at liberty to avail any other alternate remedy, but in accordance with law.
