Petitioners are praying for direction to respondents No.1 to 3

to provide protection to their life and liberty from the hands of private respondents No.4 and 5.

2. In the petition, it has been stated that both the petitioners are into live-in-relationship which has been opposed by private respondents No.4 and 5, who are related to petitioner No.2.

3. Counsel for the petitioners submits that petitioner No.1 a male aged about 21 years and petitioner No.2 a female aged about 18 years both of whom are unmarried, are into live-in-relationship which is opposed by respondents No.4 and 5, who are parents of petitioner No.2. It is further submitted that the said private respondents have threatened to cause harm to the petitioners and in this regard representation dated 08.04.2024(Annexure P-3) is submitted to respondent No.2 i.e. Senior Superintendent of Police, Tarn Taran but the police officials have failed to take any action against the private respondents in this regard.

4. Notice of motion.

Mr. Jasjeet Singh Dhaliwal, AAG, Punjab accepts notice on behalf of respondents No. 1 to 3 and submits that in case any such representation is pending, the concerned authority will look into the matter and take action in accordance with law.

In view of above, without going into the merits of the case, this petition is hereby disposed of with direction to Senior Superintendent of Police, Tarn Taran to consider representation dated 08.04.2024(Annexure P-3) and to take action if so warranted in accordance with law in case there is any threat perception to the petitioners.

However, any observations made in this order will not be construed as an expression of opinion on the validity of the relationship of the petitioners. It is also made clear that respondents No.4 and 5 are at liberty to avail appropriate remedy available to them under law against the petitioners. In case the petitioners have committed any offence, law will take its own course.
