This is a criminal writ petition filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India for issuance of a writ in the nature of mandamus directing the official respondents to protect the life and liberty of the petitioner and its workers.

Learned counsel appearing for respondents no.5 and 6 has pointed out that respondent no.6 is the Secretary of the petitioner association and has filed a complaint against the petitioner for misappropriating Rs.33 lacs from the society funds and the said facts have not been mentioned in the present writ petition and it has not been mentioned in the present writ petition that respondent no.6 is in fact the Secretary of the petitioner association. It is further submitted that no specific instance of any harassment even remotely has been mentioned in

the entire petition or even in the representation dated 08.04.2024. It is stated that the present writ petition is stated to have been filed by the association but there is no resolution in favour of Harjeet Singh authorizing him to file the present writ petition.

3. Learned State counsel has pointed out that a case under the NDPS Act has also been registered against Harjeet Singh through whom the present writ petition has been filed.

4. Learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that in view of the same, she seeks to withdraw the present writ petition with liberty to file a fresh petition after giving full and better particulars.

5. In view of the statement made by learned counsel for the petitioner, the present petition is dismissed as withdrawn with the aforesaid liberty.

6. It is made clear that in case any such petition is filed, then the same would be considered independently, in accordance with law.
