JAGMOHAN BANSAL, J. (Oral)

1. The petitioner through instant petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India is seeking setting aside of order dated 03.04.2024 (Annexure P-10) whereby respondent-IOCL has stopped supply/delivery of oil to him.

2. The petitioner alongwith his father was partner of a firm which was operating a petrol pump allotted by respondent-IOCL. Father of the petitioner has passed away and during his life time, he had executed a Will in petitioner's favour. A dispute with respect to property of father of petitioner is pending before this Court. Father of the petitioner had made a statement before Mediation Centre, Kurukshetra to the effect that after his death his whole property should devolve upon his son-petitioner. Despite said facts, the respondent has stopped supply/delivery of oil to the petitioner on the ground that he has failed to

get NOC from his sisters who are contesting litigating before this Court.

3. Mr. Ashish Kapoor, learned counsel for the respondent who on advance notice is present in Court submits that petitioner has filed representation dated 11.04.2024 (Annexurre P-11) before respondent-Corporation and it is still pending.

4. On the asking of Court, Mr. Kapoor submits that Competent Authority would decide petitioner’s representation dated 11.04.2024 within a week from today.

5. In the wake of statement of learned counsel for the respondent, the present petition stands disposed of.
