Prayer in the present writ petition is for seeking issuance of directions to the respondents to make the payment of the bills (Annexures P-1 to P-319) with respect to the jobs undertaken and supplies made by the petitioner.

Learned counsel appearing for the petitioner contends that under similar circumstances CWP-19552-2023 was disposed of by this Court vide order dated 04.09.2023, directing the respondents to take a decision on the representation submitted by the petitioner and that upon considering the said representation, if any amount is found due and payable to the petitioner, the same shall be disbursed in favour of the petitioner within a further period of three months.

Notice of motion.

On the asking of the Court, Mr. Vivek Saini, Addl. A.G. Haryana, who is present in the Court, accepts notice on behalf of the respondents. He submits that the present petition has been filed by clubbing a large number of bills which are *prima facie* beyond the period of limitation prescribed.

On being confronted, learned counsel for the petitioner contends that, at this juncture, he is confining relief only with respect to the jobs undertaken/supplies made by the petitioner since April 2021 onwards and that he shall pursue his alternative remedies with respect to the bills/invoices for the period prior thereto.

Accordingly, with the consent of the parties and without commenting upon the merits of the case, the present petition is disposed of and respondent No.4-the Executive Engineer (XEN), Public Health Engineering Division No.1, Sirsa, is directed to take note of the claim sent by the petitioner and to pass a reasoned and speaking order thereupon in accordance with law preferably within a period of three months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.

Needless to mention that in the event the entitlement of the petitioner being established as per law, the payment due to the petitioner shall be released expeditiously and preferably within a further period of three months.

Petition stands disposed of accordingly.
