1. This is a Civil Writ Petition filed under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India for the issuance of a writ in the nature of Mandamus directing the respondent to include the timings of the petitioner's permit in the time table dated 7.2.2023 (Annexure P-2).

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that in the time table dated 07.02.2023 (Annexure P-2) the timings of the petitioner's permit were not included and in the said time table it was specifically stated that if any person had any objection, then, the said objection could be filed. It is submitted that petitioner had filed objections dated 17.03.2023 (Annexure P-3) but till date no order has been passed on the same and has thus prayed that at this stage, he would be satisfied in case the respondent decides the said objections (Annexure P-3) in a time bound manner.

3. Learned State Counsel has submitted that in case the said objections are not decided by the respondent, then the objections dated

17.03.2023 (Annexure P-3) would be decided within a period of six weeks from the date of receipt of a certified copy of the present order.

4. Keeping in view the above said facts and circumstances, the present Civil Writ Petition is disposed of with a direction to the competent authority of State of Punjab to consider the objections dated 17.03.2023 (Annexure P-3), which is stated to have been filed by the petitioner against the joint time table dated 07.02.2023 for the Ludhiana-Kohara route, in case not already decided within a period of six weeks from the date of receipt of certified copy of the present order. In case, the said objections have already been decided, then, a copy of the said order be supplied to the petitioner on payment of usual charges, within a period of three weeks from the date of receipt of a certified copy of the present order.

5. This Court has not opined on the merits of the case and the competent authority of State of Punjab would consider the case of the petitioner independently, in accordance with law.
