- The Motor Accident Claims Tribunal has passed an Award dated 16.03.2023, against the petitioner for an amount of Rs. 14,06,900/-. The claim petition was filed in the year 2016. In order to implement the aforesaid award, the claimants had filed the execution petition in which the Executing Court has issued the warrants of attachment. The correctness of the aforesaid order has been challenged in this revision petition. As per the impugned order, the petitioner has already transferred the property in favour of his wife and son. The aforesaid property cannot be attached.
