ANIL KSHETARPAL, J.

1. Learned counsel representing the respondent has objected to the maintainability of the revision petition on the ground that the third party objections have been allowed and the same is amenable to challenge before the First Appellate Court under Order 21 Rule 101 of the Code of Civil Procedure, 1908.
2. Learned counsel representing the petitioner does not dispute this fact, however, he submits that he may be permitted to file the first appeal within 15 days and the respondent should not contest the appeal on delay in filing the appeal.
3. Learned counsel representing the respondent has no objection.
4. Keeping in view the aforesaid facts, the revision petition is disposed of with the observation that if the petitioner files the appeal within a

period of 15 days from today, the same shall not be dismissed on delay. The First Appellate Court shall decide the case on merits.
