1. Present petition has been filed under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 (for short 'Cr.P.C.') seeking issuance of directions to respondents No.1 to 3 to register the FIR under appropriate Sections against respondents No.4 to 10, as they, in connivance with each other, had kidnapped the petitioner and performed her Nikah and to take strict legal action against them.

2. Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Pawan Kumar, at the outset, submits that nothing survives in the present petition, as grievance



raised by the petitioner has been substantially redressed. In compliance of the order dated 01.05.2024, he has produced on record status report by way of affidavit of Jagdish Raj, PPS, Deputy Superintendent of Police, Sub Division Dasuya, District Hoshiarpur, on behalf of respondents No.1 to 3, in the Court today and the same is taken on record and perusal of its para No.5 indicates that FIR No.106 dated 23.05.2024 under Section 376-D, 506, 346 of IPC has been registered at Police Station Dasuya, District Hoshiarpur against 07 persons and 10-12 unknown persons, out of which, one accused has already been arrested.

3. In view of the above, present petition is disposed of as having been rendered infructuous.
