1. Present petition has been filed for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in PO proceedings/Proclamation for person absconding under Section 82 Cr.P.C., emanating in complaint No.NACT/1403/2023 dated 02.02.2022 in the Court of Ld. JMIC/Chief Judicial Magistrate, Bathinda. Further prayer has been made to release the petitioner on bail as and when he surrenders himself before the said Court and in the meantime the petitioner may kindly be released on interim bail.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that both the sides have amicably resolved the issue and the petitioner has made the part payment to the complainant. He has submitted that vide order dated 08.05.2024 while issuing notice of motion, this Court had directed the petitioner to join the proceedings before the trial Court and trial Court was directed to release him on interim bail on his furnishing bail/surety bonds to its satisfaction. Learned Counsel has stated that in pursuance to the said order the petitioner has appeared and has been admitted to bail by



the trial Court. He has further submitted that the petitioner has compromised the matter with the complainant and has suffered the statement before the trial Court in this regard. He has placed on record copy of the order dated 02.08.2024, wherein this fact has been recorded by the learned trial Court. He has further stated that the petitioner is ready to join the proceedings and face the consequences of the trial.

3. Learned State counsel has opposed the submissions made by learned counsel for the petitioner and has stated that the trial Court has rightly cancelled the bail granted of the petitioner.

3. After hearing counsel for the parties and taking into consideration the facts and circumstances of the case, this Court finds that the parties have compromised the matter and have decided to bury the hatchet. The petitioner was granted the interim bail and in pursuance to the same, he was stated to have joined the proceedings and is regularly appearing before the trial Court. Under these circumstances, the present petition is disposed of and the petitioner is directed to appear before the trial Court regularly as and when required by it and order dated 08.05.2024 granting interim bail granted to the petitioner is made absolute subject to his already furnished bail/surety bonds to the satisfaction of the concerned Trial Court/Duty Magistrate at the time of his release on interim bail.
