Present application has been filed for preponing the date of hearing of the main writ petition i.e. CWP-10923-2020, which was adjourned to 01.10.2024.

Mr. Satnam Preet Singh, learned Deputy Advocate General, Punjab, accepts notice on behalf of the respondent-State and Mr. Nikhil Singh, Advocate, accepts notice on behalf of respondents No. 2 and 3. They raise no objection for the grant of the prayer as raised in the present application.



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Keeping in view the averments made in the application, which are duly supported by an affidavit, the application is allowed and hearing the main petition i.e CWP-10923-2020 is preponed from 01.10.2024 to today.

CWP-10923-2020

1. In the present writ petition, the grievance being raised by the petitioner is that his complete pensionary benefits have not been released on the ground that the petitioner is facing disciplinary proceedings even after his retirement.

2. The petitioner has shown prejudice that even after expiry of five years, the respondents have not concluded the disciplinary proceedings and on the other hand, his pensionary benefits are being withheld, which is arbitrary and illegal.

3. Learned counsel for respondents No. 2 and 3-Board submits that all the disciplinary proceedings pending against the petitioner, will be concluded by 30.09.2024 and whatever the benefits, which the petitioner is found entitled for upon conclusion of the disciplinary proceedings, will be released to him within a further period of six weeks.

4. Keeping in view the statement of learned counsel for respondents No. 2 and 3-Board, no further orders are required to be passed in the present writ petition and the same is disposed of in terms of the statement of learned counsel for respondents No. 2 and 3.

5. It is made clear that in case, there is violation of the undertaking recorded, serious view will be taken including the initiation of



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contempt proceedings as a retiree is waiting for his dues even after five years of his retirement.
