VIKAS BAHL, J.(ORAL)

1. This is a civil writ petition filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India for issuance of a writ in the nature of mandamus directing the respondents to correct the authorization certificate of national permit (Goods) of the vehicle of the petitioner.
2. Learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that for the grievances raised by the petitioner, the petitioner had given an application dated 02.04.2024 (Annexure P-8) and at this stage, would be satisfied in case the said application is considered by respondent no.3 in a time bound manner and if after considering the same, in case, the pleas raised by the petitioner are found to be meritorious, then necessary relief be granted to the petitioner.

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3. Learned State counsel has submitted that respondent no.3 would consider the said application and decide the same within a period of 4 weeks from the date of the receipt of certified copy of the present order.
4. Keeping in view the above said facts and circumstances, the present petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent no.3 to consider the application dated 02.04.2024 (Annexure P-8) of the petitioner and decide the same, in accordance with law, as expeditiously as possible, preferably within a period of 4 weeks from the date of the receipt of certified copy of the present order and in case, after considering the same, the pleas of the petitioner are found to be meritorious, then necessary relief be granted to the petitioner and in case, the pleas of the petitioner are not found to be meritorious, then a speaking order rejecting the same be passed within a period of 4 weeks from the date of the receipt of certified copy of the present order.
5. It is made clear that this Court has not opined on the merits of the case and respondent no.3 would consider and decide the application independently, in accordance with law.
