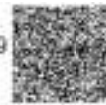

SANJIV BERRY, J. (ORAL)

By way of present petition filed under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973, petitioner seeks anticipatory bail in case FIR (Annexure P-1) as under:

FIR No.	Dated	Sections	Police Station
4	01.02.2024	420, 120-B IPC; (406 IPC added later on)	NRI, District Patiala

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that in compliance to the order dated 02.05.2024 passed by this Court, the petitioner has already joined the investigation and as such interim bail granted to the petitioner may be confirmed.



3. Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Gurdeep Singh has intimated that the petitioner has joined investigation and is no more required for any custodial investigation in this case nor he is required for further investigation.

4. Heard.

5. During the course of hearing on 02.05.2024, the following order was passed:-

“ Inter-alia submits that the mere allegation is that the car is not being transferred in the name of the complainant, though the same is in his possession. Thus, the allegation even if taken on their face value, would not constitute offence punishable under Sections 420, 120-B and 406 IPC.

Notice of motion.

On asking of the Court, Mr. Tarun Aggarwal, Sr. D.A.G., Punjab appears and accepts notice on behalf of the respondent/State.

Adjourned to 24.07.2024.

In the meantime, in the event of arrest, the petitioner shall be released on interim bail subject to his furnishing personal and surety bonds to the satisfaction of the Arresting Officer/Investigating Officer. As and when called, the petitioner shall join the investigation. He shall abide by the conditions enumerated under Section 438(2) of the Cr.P.C.”

6. Keeping in view the above submissions made by learned State counsel and the fact that the petitioner had joined the investigation consequent to the order dated 02.05.2024 passed by this Court, interim bail granted vide order dated 02.05.2024 is hereby confirmed, subject to conditions as envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. Further the petitioner is directed to join investigation as and when required in future by way of written notice for such purpose to be served by Investigating Officer of this case upon the petitioner; he will not tamper with the evidence nor will



influence the witnesses and will not leave the country without prior permission of the Court.

7. The petition stands allowed.
