MAIN CASE

The instant petition has been filed for seeking issuance of directions to the respondent No.1 to register the petitioner as a Pharmacist under the Pharmacy Act, 1948.

2 The learned counsel for the respondent No.1 contends that the necessary registration has already been issued in favour of the petitioner.

3 Learned counsel appearing for the petitioner does not dispute the same. However, he submits that some compensatory costs be awarded in favour of the petitioner.

4 The aspect of compensatory costs is a matter which would require leading of evidence. The petitioner may if so advised take recourse to the remedies available to him in accordance with law.

5 In view of above, the present petition is disposed of as having been rendered infructuous.
